She asked how many acres of open land are left in the Town of Wallkill and why the Town wants to maintain 50%. She encouraged meetings be set up with large landowners so that individual questions can be answered. She added Palisades Park is preserved land which is not maintained and too much emphasis is on conservation and not future development and direction of the Town.

N. Guenste asked about enterprise and light industry where it is residential. She would like to see public hearing kept open and people notified of this major undertaking of the Town.
