A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE BOND RESOLUTION DATED DECEMBER 22, 2005, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,500,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL, ORANGE COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE RECONSTRUCTION AND FURNISHING OF THE TOWN HALL BUILDINGS LOCATED AT 99 AND 111 TOWER DRIVE, IN AND FOR SAID TOWN.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, has adopted a bond resolution dated December 22, 2005, authorizing the issuance of \$1,500,000 bonds of said Town to pay the cost of the reconstruction and furnishing of the Town Hall buildings located at 99 and 111 Tower Drive, in and for the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, an providing for a period of probable usefulness of five years and a maximum maturity of said bonds of five years; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board now wishes to increase the maximum maturity of said bonds from the five years provided in said bond resolution to the twenty-five year maximum maturity permitted by the Local Finance Law of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital project hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, as follows:

Section A. The bond resolution of this Town Board dated and duly adopted on December 22, 2005, authorizing the issuance of \$1,500,000 bonds to pay the cost of the reconstruction and furnishing of the Town Hall buildings located at 99 and 111 Tower Drive in and for the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, is hereby amended, in part, to read as follows:

“Section 3. It is hereby determined that the Town Hall buildings located at 99 and 111 Tower Drive are class “A” buildings within the meaning of subdivision eleven of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is twenty-five years, pursuant to subdivision twelve of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, calculated from January 26, 2006, the date of issuance of the first obligations for said purpose. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds authorized will exceed five years.

“Section 11. Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in summary in the *Time Herald Record*, the official newspaper of the Town, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

“Section 12. This resolution is adopted subject to permissive referendum in accordance with Section 35.00 of the Local Finance Law.”

Section B. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by the bond resolution dated and duly adopted December 22, 2005, as amended by this bond resolution, may be contested only if:

1. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
2. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
3. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section C. Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in summary in *Times Herald Record*, the official newspaper of the Town, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

WHEREAS, a written map, plan and study dated 24th day of October, 2007 in due form from McGoey, Hauser and Edsall, Engineers for the Town of Wallkill has been filed with the Town Clerk on or about the 24th day of October, 2007 for the proposed creation of the Crystal Run Road Transportation Improvement District (“the District”) in the Town of Wallkill, bounded and described in a metes and bounds description by McGoey, Hauser and Edsall and in the Map included with the map, plan and study and which concerns lots designated on the Tax Map as Section 41 Block 1, Section 60 Block 1 and Section 78 Block 1 and the lots designated therein and as specified in the map, plan and study, with the benefit area being generally bounded on the north by Goshen Turnpike, on the east by the Wallkill River, on the south by Route 17 and the west by Interstate Route 84, and will include the properties on both the east and west side of Ballard Road between Crystal Run Road and Wes Warren Drive, with a more detailed description of the tax map parcels and the metes and bounds description being attached to this Order as Schedule A, and

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed through the establishment of the District consist of the construction of an interconnecting road between the proposed East Main Street Extension and Crystal Run Road, intersecting near Crystal Run Crossing as part of the NYSDOT Route 17, Exit 122 interchange project (“the Improvements”), all in accordance with the map, plan and study referred to above and now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town, and

WHEREAS, it is the intention through the creation of the District to have the Improvements constructed as a District cost and to be shared by property owners in the District, and

WHEREAS, the estimated maximum cost of the Improvements is \$4,700,000.00 to be raised through bonding over twenty, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the Improvements to the benefited properties in the District vary and is set forth with more specificity in the map, plan and study, and the estimated cost of the Improvements to the typical one- or two-family home therein is \$0.00, since those properties will be exempt from paying any of the costs of the Improvements, and

WHEREAS, a detailed estimation of the manner by which the costs of the Improvements were computed has been filed in the Office of the Town Clerk where the same is available during regular office hours for examination by any person interested in the subject matter thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on 8th day of November, 2007 at 7:25 o'clock P.M. on said day the Town Board will meet and hold a public hearing to consider the creation of the Crystal Run Road Transportation Improvement District, including the environmental significance thereof, and to hear all persons interested in the subject therefore, and for such other and further action on the part of the Town Board in connection with this matter as may be appropriate, and be it

FURTHER ORDERED that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to publish a certified copy of this Order at least once in the official newspaper of the Town not less than 10 nor more than 20 days before the date of the hearing, and be it
