RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL ADOPTING A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE TOWN CODE TO INCLUDE THE CATHOLIC AND PROTESTANT CEMETERY, LOCATED ALONG COUNTY ROUTE 78, AS A PROTECTED CEMETERY UNDER CHAPTER 249-8.1(A) OF THE WALLKILL TOWN CODE

WHEREAS, a resolution was duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill for a public hearing to be held by said Governing Body on November 8, 2007, at 7:25 p.m. at Town Hall, 99 Tower Drive, Middletown, New York, to hear all interested parties on a proposed Local Law entitled A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 249 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL, COUNTY OF ORANGE, AMENDING SECTION 8.1 OF THE ZONING CODE TO INCLUDE AN ADDITIONAL CEMETERY; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the Times Herald-Record, the official newspaper of said Town, on October 26, 2007; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held on November 8, 2007 at or about 7:25 p.m. at Wallkill Town Hall, 99 Tower Drive, Middletown, New York, and all parties in attendance were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed Local Law, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), it has been determined by the Town Board of said Town that adoption of said proposed Local Law is a Type II Action under SEQRA and requires no further review under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of said Town to adopt said Local Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill hereby adopts said Local Law No. 18 of 2007, entitled A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 249 OF THE

CODE OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL, COUNTY OF ORANGE, AMENDING SECTION 8.1 OF THE ZONING CODE TO INCLUDE AN ADDITIONAL CEMETERY; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and in the Local Law Book of the Town of Wallkill and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State of New York.

LOCAL LAW NO. 18 OF 2007

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 249 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL, COUNTY OF ORANGE, AMENDING SECTION 8.1 OF THE ZONING CODE TO INCLUDE AN ADDITIONAL CEMETERY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Wallkill Code, Chapter 249 ZONING, Section 249-8.1 entitled "Cemetery protection" shall be and hereby is amended by this Local Law as follows:

Add to the list of cemeteries and locations the following text:

Cemetery	Location
Catholic and Protestant Cemetery	Along County Route 78 and the access road to Tuckerman Hall

Section 2. Separability

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 3. Repeal

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

WHEREAS, the Town Board’s resolution authorizing the sale of the property was subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Section 64(2) of the Town Law of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk received no petition objecting to the adoption of the resolution to sell the foregoing property; and

WHEREAS, the Town has now negotiated a contract of sale for the property with Goddard Development Partners, LLC, and Cosimo’s Brick Oven Pizza (a copy of which is annexed to this resolution); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed the annexed contract and has determined that executing the contract and selling the property is in the best interests of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY

RESOLVED that said Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute a Contract of Sale with Goddard Development Partners, LLC, and Cosimo’s Brick Oven Pizza, or such entity as may be formed by the purchasers, for the sale of the aforesaid property; and it is further

RESOLVED that the Town Supervisor is authorized and directed to execute any and all documents, take all steps necessary and expend all reasonable sums on behalf of the Town to consummate the transaction as set forth in the annexed contract of sale.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,290,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL, ORANGE COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO FINANCE THE COSTS OF THE PAYMENT OF A SETTLEMENT OF LITIGATION AGAINST THE TOWN KNOWN AS CLUBSIDE v. TOWN OF WALLKILL & ED SMITH.

RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, as follows:

Section 1.

For financing the costs of the settlement of litigation against the Town known as Clubside v. Town of Wallkill & Ed Smith, for the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, a specific object or purpose, there are hereby authorized to be issued \$1,290,000 bonds of said Town pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2.

It is hereby determined that the estimated maximum cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is \$1,290,000, and that the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of the \$1,290,000 bonds of the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, authorized to be issued pursuant to this bond resolution.

Section 3.

It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision thirty-three of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4.

Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5.

The faith and credit of said Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent such appropriation is not made from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 6.

Such bonds shall be in fully registered form and shall be signed in the name of the Town of Wallkill, Orange County, New York, by the manual or facsimile signature of the Supervisor and a facsimile of its corporate seal shall be imprinted or impressed thereon and may be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Town Clerk.

Section 7.

The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as the Supervisor shall deem best for the interests of the Town; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the Supervisor shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquaintance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8.

All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds, including determining whether to issue such bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service and all matters related thereto, prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the Town by the facsimile signature of its Supervisor, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the Town), the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Supervisor. It is hereby determined that it is to the financial advantage of the Town not to impose and collect from registered owners of such bonds any charges for mailing, shipping and insuring bonds transferred or exchanged by the fiscal agent, and, accordingly, pursuant to paragraph c of Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, no such charges shall be so collected by the fiscal agent. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 9.

This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150 - 2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are,

or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 10.

The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11.

This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary in The Times Herald Record, the official newspaper of the Town, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 233, SECTION 4 OF THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF WALLKILL TO DESIGNATE A STOP INTERSECTION AT STONY FORD ROAD AND STAGE ROAD

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill on November 8, 2007 adopted a resolution to set the time and place for a public hearing regarding the adoption of a local law to amend Chapter 233, Section 4 of the Town Code of Wallkill to designate a stop intersection at Stony Ford Road and Slaughter Road; and

WHEREAS, the correct location of the stop intersection is Stony Ford Road and Stage Road; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to correct the location of the stop intersection in its previously adopted resolution of November 8, 2007; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in its previous resolution of November 8, 2007, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill wishes adopt a local law to amend the Town Code of the Town of Wallkill to designate a stop intersection and to permit the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works to install traffic control devices at the intersection of Stony Ford Road and Stage Road; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill is empowered by the State to adopt such local law pursuant to Section 1660 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wallkill wishes to hold a public hearing to determine whether or not the designation of a stop intersection at Stony Ford Road and Stage Road is in the best interests of the public safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held by the Town Board with respect to the adoption of the aforesaid Local Law shall be held on December 13, 2007 at 7:25 p.m. at Wallkill Town Hall, 99 Tower Drive - Bldg. A, Middletown, New York; and it is further
